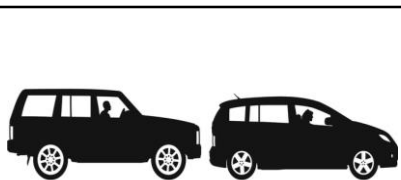


## Allowable Vehicles Classes on I-77 Express

- Vehicles matching the following descriptions may use I-77 Express with an appropriate transponder (E-ZPass, SunPass or Peach Pass) or bill-by-mail.
- Toll exemptions are determined by the vehicle's purpose, such as HOVs, first responder vehicles and motorcycles.
- Any vehicle not within the guidelines for the vehicle classes listed below will be prohibited from using the express lanes.



LOVs & HOV3+s exclude motorcycles and vehicles pulling trailers.

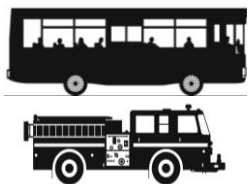
### Vehicle Classes 101 & 102 - Low Occupancy Vehicle (LOV) and High Occupancy Vehicle (HOV3+)

- A LOV measures less than or equal to 20 feet in length, 8.5 feet in width, 12 feet in height and contains less than three passengers.
- A HOV3+ measures less than or equal to 20 feet in length, 8.5 feet in width, 12 feet in height, contains three or more passengers, and requires one of the following two methods to declare its HOV3+ status before entering I-77 Express:
  - Engaging the HOV3+ switch on a NC Quick Pass transponder installed within the vehicle
  - Declaring HOV3+ status using the NC Quick Pass app for vehicles using non-switchable NC Quick Pass transponders, such as decal and exterior transponders



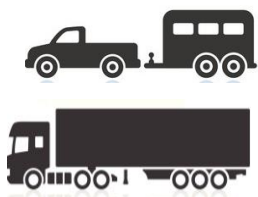
### Vehicle Class 103 - Motorcycles

Motor vehicles with two or three wheels and not larger than a LOV



### Vehicle Classes 106 & 107 - Special Vehicles

Special vehicles are determined by the North Carolina Department of Transportation or North Carolina Turnpike Authority and are issued applicable transponders. Special vehicles can be greater than 20 feet in length, 8.5 feet in width, 12 feet in height, with more than two axles. (e.g. emergency vehicles and public transit vehicles)



### Prohibited Vehicles

With the exception of designated special vehicles, vehicles exceeding 20 feet in length, 8.5 feet in width and 12 feet in height **may not** use the express lanes. Vehicles with trailers or more than two axles are also prohibited from using the express lanes. Examples of prohibited vehicles include school buses, church buses, vehicles towing trailers or RVs, large moving trucks/vans (i.e. U-Haul) and similar vehicles.
